PROCEDURES & SUMMARY RULES

GENERAL RULES:

1. The Match Director reserves the right to alter the event as weather, terrain or registration dictates.
2. The Range Commander may modify or make procedural match changes in the interest of safety and/or to make the event run more smoothly. The Range Commander will have the final say on issues of safety and range protocol.
3. Physically challenged accommodations must be requested at registration and approved by the Match Director.
4. To be eligible to participate in this Shooting Sports meet, participants must be enrolled as a 4-H Shooting Sports project member and have met the criteria set by their county Shooting Sports Committee for the disciplines they are entering.
5. These competition classes are recognized for this shoot:
 - Junior Competitors: age 8 - 11
 - Intermediate Competitors: ages 12 - 14
 - Senior Competitors: ages 15 - 19
 - Participants must shoot in the age category according to their age as of July 9, 2021.
6. All competitors must be able to compete effectively in a safe manner.
Participants must provide:
 - Proper eye protection (i.e. prescription glasses, safety glasses or goggles).
 - Proper hearing protection (i.e. muffs or ear plugs)
7. Range Commanders have the right to deny use of unsafe equipment on the range.
8. Participants are responsible for providing their own equipment, including ammunition. 12 and 20 gauge shells will be available on site for purchase.
9. All guns must be in a carry case except when preparing for use at the range and during competition.
10. Iron sights will include open, peep and fiber optic sights.
11. All competitors must maintain proper sportsmanship with other competitors at all times.
12. National Event: Participants must have passed their 14th birthday by January 1st of the year they are qualifying and not have passed their 19th birthday by January 1st of the year of the National Event.

SHAWANO COUNTY 4-H ALL-STAR SUMMER SHOOTOUT RULES

SHOTGUN – TRAP

(Intermediate (12-14) and Senior (15-19) Divisions)

1. 12, 16 and 20 gauge shotguns are allowed.
2. Shooters will fire from 16 yards.
3. Both divisions will shoot **two rounds**, of 25 clays each, for the events. **No practice birds will be thrown!**
4. Magnum or baby magnum loads, are not permitted.
5. Participants must provide:
 - Proper eye protection (i.e. prescription glasses, safety glasses or goggles).
 - Proper hearing protection (i.e. muffs or ear plugs)
6. Shot size from 7½ to 9 is required. Shooters must provide their own shells. 12 and 20 gauge shells will be available for purchase.
7. No shotguns with release triggers allowed.
8. No coaching permitted during a round.
9. Physically challenged accommodations must be requested at registration and approved by the Match Director.
10. Amateur Trapshooting Association rules govern, except for the above rules and when the Match Director alters rules to allow for the smooth operation of the shoot.
11. **Reminder for all shooters and 4-H National Qualifying Opportunity Participants:** National 4-H Competition does not allow any load with a velocity greater than 1,290 feet per second with a maximum shot charge of 1-1/8 ounces or 1,325 feet per second with a maximum shot charge of 7/8 ounce or less, as measured in any individual shot shell. In addition no load containing more than 1-1/8 ounce or any shot larger than Number 7-1/2 can be used.
12. In the event of ties, awards shall be decided on the basis of the longest run in the total event beginning with the first target hit. If a tie remains, a ten shoot-off will be shot; 2 clays per station. Should this not resolve the tie, the event will be decided by a station by station (1 shot) “sudden death.”

SHAWANO COUNTY 4-H ALL-STAR SUMMER SHOOTOUT RULES

Hunt & Cover

1. Hunt and Cover is a team event with 2 members (“hunter” person & “cover” person) standing side by side at each shooting station. Shooters may use any gauge shotgun for this class.
2. There are 50 clays thrown for this event so make sure that you have enough shells. The maximum score is 50 hits.
3. The (first person) “hunter” calls for the target and shoots (hit =2 team points), if the “hunter” misses, the (second person) “cover” **can now shoot** to break the target (hit = 1 team point and miss - loss = 0).
4. If the “hunter” breaks the target and the “cover” shoots, the hit will be recorded as a loss for the “hunter” (0 team points).
5. The “hunter” shoots first at this position per normal trap rules for five clays.
6. Without changing shooting positions on the firing line, the “cover” person from the first set now becomes the “hunter”. The original “hunter” now becomes the “cover” person.
7. Repeat steps #3, #4, and #5.
8. After each person on all the teams has been the hunter 5 times, all of the teams shall rotate to the next station as per regular trap rules.
9. The highest team score will be the winner.
10. Ties will be determined by the team who has the longest string of broken targets starting from the last clay hit. In the event there still is a tie, the next or second longest string of broken targets will be used and so on. If a tie still exists, a shoot off will take place determined by the range commander based on time and shooting conditions.

SHAWANO COUNTY 4-H ALL-STAR SUMMER SHOOTOUT RULES

.22 RIFLE (Intermediate (12-14) or Senior (15-19) Divisions)

1. Each shooter will fire three positions; prone, standing and kneeling, in that order at 50 feet.
2. Standard A-17 targets will be used; one target will be shot at each position for score. Sighting-in is limited to 5 minutes with unlimited shots before the prone position only. The shooter may inspect targets after the sight-in period only.
3. Rifles must be plugged or otherwise prepared so they may be loaded and fired in a single shot fashion only. Actions must be able mechanically to be held open until ready to fire. **Semi-automatic rifles not so modified will not be allowed on the range** (Because of the difficulty in loading semi-automatic rifles; they are not recommended!) **RANGE COMMANDER WILL INSPECT!!**
4. No optically assisted sights or laser sights are permitted.
5. Only rifles capable of firing .22 long rifle ammunition are acceptable. No .22 magnum are allowed. Rifles may be modified by adjusting stock length only.
6. Slings are allowed for prone and kneeling positions only; kneeling rolls are allowed for kneeling position.
7. Since this is a National qualifying event, full NRA gear is allowed (jackets, pants, glove and shoes) for unlimited. Only shooting glove is allowed for sporter.
8. Classes: Sporter Class: The rifle cannot weigh more than 7 ½ lbs. Sights (including open and peep must have a trigger pull of at least 2 lbs. Unlimited Class: There shall be no restrictions on barrel length or overall weight of the rifle.
9. Shooters will provide their own ammunition.
10. Participants must provide:
 - Proper eye protection (i.e. prescription glasses, safety glasses or goggles).
 - Proper hearing protection (i.e. muffs or ear plugs)
11. Firing time is limited to 10 minutes per stage (position); 10 shots per stage.
12. Adaptations for handicapped shooters must be approved by the county Project Coordinator and Range Commander prior to the event.
13. Tiebreakers: ties will be broken with most number of “tens”. Most numbers of “nines”, most number of “eights” etc; 2nd tiebreaker: first “ten” hit in sequence until tie is broken.
14. No coaching on the line or spotting during sighting-in period.

SHAWANO COUNTY 4-H ALL-STAR SUMMER SHOOTOUT RULES

.22 SILHOUETTE EVENTS (Intermediate (12-14) & Senior (15-19) Divisions)

1. Two events will be shot. These events are Silhouette with Iron Sights and Silhouette with Scope.
2. Only .22 caliber rifles that fire .22 long rifle are acceptable.
3. Participants must provide:
 - Proper eye protection (i.e. prescription glasses, safety glasses or goggles).
 - Proper hearing protection (i.e. muffs or ear plugs)
4. Firing positions include standing. Youth may use military or Olympic form. No artificial supports and no slings.
5. Course of fire consists of 40 shots fired. Each round will consist of the following:
 - A. Ten chickens at 40 yards; height of 2¼”.
 - B. Ten pigs at 60 yards; height of 3”.
 - C. Ten turkeys at 77 yards; height of 4½”.
 - D. Ten rams at 100 yards; height of 5½”.
6. Course may be shortened proportionally, depending on the needs of the event to be determined by the Range Master and Meet Coordinator.
7. **TIME LIMITS:**
 - A. Ready time – Fifteen (15) seconds will be allowed after the command “READY” before the command “FIRE”.
 - B. Five minutes will be allowed to fire 10 shots, one shot at each target in the bank of 10 targets.
 - C. Competitors must fire at the targets in sequence, beginning left and progressing to the right. NO HITS are allowed for targets fired out of sequence.
8. Scoring is based on one point for each silhouette knocked down in proper sequence. Total possible points are 40!
9. Each shooter may have one coach at the firing line who may have a scope or binoculars and advise the shooter where shots are going, keep time, or otherwise advise. The coach may not touch the shooter or any equipment after the shooter assumes a position on the firing line.
10. Tie Breaker - Beginning at the longest targets, review combined (10 targets) scores for most hits at that distance; if still tied move to next closest target, etc. until tie is broken.

SHAWANO COUNTY 4-H ALL-STAR SUMMER SHOOTOUT RULES

RANGE COMMANDS (.22 Small Bore Rifle)

1. **SHOOTERS TO THE LINE** (5-10 minutes)
 - This is the time the shooters use to get their equipment to shooting line.
 - Firearms are uncased at the shooting line.
 - Firearms are pointed down range, muzzle down range.
 - Actions open.
 - Firearms are not handled
2. **PREPARATION TIME HAS STARTED** (5-10 minutes)
 - Shooters may prepare the equipment for their particular shooting position.
 - May handle firearm with no ammo.
 - Fingers outside of trigger guard.
3. **LINE CHECK** (Is the line Ready?)
 - Ready on the left—If answer is no, give more time; if yes, continue.
 - Ready on the right—If answer is no, give more time; if yes, continue.
 - The line is ready
4. **SHOOTERS LOAD YOUR FIREARM**
 - Single load only.
 - **Do not fire!**
5. **COMMENCE FIRING**
 - Fire designated rounds only.
 - When finished shooting, lay firearm down with action open and muzzle down range
6. **CEASE FIRE**
 - Action open, safety on, muzzle down range, and lay firearms down!
 - It may mean:
 - A. Problem on the line.
 - B. That round, or event, is over
 - C. A new set of targets
 - D. Range is unsafe.
7. **IS THE LINE CLEAR?**
 - If someone says no, see what the problem is!
8. **RANGE IS CLOSED**
 - Shooter cases the firearm, picks up equipment and removes it from the firing line.
 - Absolutely no handling of uncased firearms!

SMALL-BORE PISTOL General Rules

Welcome to Small-bore Pistol Shooting!

The objective of our 4-H Shooting Sports firearms program is to teach safe handling and use of a gun, marksmanship skills so that the participant enjoys it and finds it rewarding and, perhaps most importantly, HAVE FUN!

Small-bore Pistol was added to the Wisconsin 4-H Shooting Sports Program in 2009. **Participants will need to be at least 12 years old and have completed Hunter Safety.** Participants and their families need to take note of the following:

Per BATF regulations, all pistol shooters under the age of 18 must have, in their possession, a written permission statement from their parent or guardian stating their permission to possess and fire Small-bore Pistols. In accordance with federal laws pertaining to youth and pistols (see Youth Safety Handgun Act), the National 4-H Shooting Sports Program prohibits the transportation of a pistol for any reason by a youth under 18 years of age. Arrangements must be made for an adult to transport all small-bore pistols.

The **Small-bore (.22) Handgun Parent/Guardian Authorization** (consent form) follows this update. The page contains two forms that will be used for the Wisconsin 4-H Shooting Sports Small-bore Pistol discipline. Both forms need to be signed, witnessed, and dated. One form needs to be given to the County or Club 4-H Shooting Sports Certified Pistol Leader to keep on file. The other form needs to be laminated and kept in the pistol case so the youth has access to it at every training session or pistol competition. **Youth will only be able to shoot the pistol at a 4-H event (practice or competition) after presenting the completed form when checking in-to the event. We recommend keeping this form in the pistol kit being used by each youth participant. Youth will also need to present proof of completion of DNR Hunter Safety.**

Youth under the age of 18 may NOT possess a small-bore pistol without adult supervision. This includes driving themselves to the event or even walking from the parking lot into the building. Similarly, at any match, parents may not just hand the cased gun to their youth in the parking area and send them on their way to the pistol event. A parent or guardian needs to accompany the youth to and from the .22 pistol event.

EYE AND EAR PROTECTION REQUIRED You may be aware that eye protection is required for Air Pistol. For Small-bore Pistol, ear protection will also be required. Ear plugs and/or protective muffs will do. A number of pistol instructors wear both. Please visit the hardware store, a sporting goods store or the sporting goods department at a neighborhood store to get proper hearing protection. Hearing protection is usually rated in terms of how much decibel reduction they provide. A higher number gives more protection.

SMALL-BORE PISTOL EVENTS There will be three events for Small-bore Pistol at this invitational. The events are Slow Fire, Timed Fire and Rapid Fire. These bullseye events will be shot one-handed.

PISTOLS and AMMO

Participants will need to bring their own .22 Long Rifle **non-jacketed** ammunition and pistol. Semiautomatic pistols are easier to shoot with for most competition, mostly because you don't have to thumb cock the hammer for each shot (remember, bullseye will be shot one-handed). Good semiautos are available from Ruger, Browning, Smith & Wesson and others. Feel free to discuss your pistol choices with your instructors.

SMALL-BORE PISTOL Rules - 25 yds

1. Classes: Intermediate - (12 yrs to 14 yrs), Senior - (15 yrs to 19 yrs). Youth must be at least 12 years old to fire a Small-bore Pistol in practice or competition.
2. Per BATF (Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives) regulations, all pistol shooters under the age of 18 must have in their possession a written permission statement from their parent or guardian stating their permission to possess and fire pistols. In accordance with federal laws pertaining to youth and pistols (see Youth Safety Handgun Act), the transportation of a pistol for any reason by a youth under 18 years of age is prohibited. Arrangements must be made for an adult to transport all pistols.
3. The Small-bore (.22) Handgun Parent/Guardian Authorization (consent form) is above. This page contains two forms that will be used for the Wisconsin 4-H Shooting Sports Small-bore Pistol discipline. Both forms need to be signed, witnessed, and dated. One form needs to be given to the County or Club 4-H Shooting Sports Certified Pistol Leader to be kept on file. The other form needs to be laminated and kept in the pistol case so the youth has access to it at every training session or pistol competition. Youth will only be able to shoot the pistol at a 4-H event (practice or competition) after presenting the completed form when checking into the event. We recommend keeping this form in the pistol kit being used by each youth participant.
4. All events are "single pistol" matches, meaning participants are to shoot the entire course of fire with the same pistol. No pistol changes are allowed between stages. Only one pistol per shooter is allowed on the line. No bolt action pistols, including cannon bolt, turn bolt or straight bolt will be permitted.
5. Target: NRA B-8
6. Distance: 25 yards
7. Course of fire: 10 shots slow fire, 15 shots timed fire and 15 shots rapid fire (40 shots for record). No sighters or warm up shots.
8. Time Limits:
 - a. Slow Fire: 5 minutes for 10 shot string of fire.
 - b. Timed Fire: 20 seconds per 5 shot string, three strings.
 - c. Rapid Fire: 10 seconds per 5 shot string, three strings.
9. Equipment: Any small-bore pistol or revolver firing the .22 long rifle, long or short rimfire cartridge with a sight radius no greater than 10 inches, and a trigger pull no less than 2 pounds. (Rule 3.4-except iron sights only.) Equipped with any sights that do not project an image onto the target.
10. Position: One-hand standing.
11. Rules: NRA Pistol Rules CP16650 (Most recent printing)
12. Information: <http://materials.nrahq.org/go/products.aspx?cat=Rulebooks>
13. Tiebreakers: Ties will be broken with the most number of X's first, then most number of tens, most number of nines, most number of eights, etc.

Muzzleloader – Silhouette Match Rules
INTERMEDIATE (AGES 12-14) AND SENIOR (AGES 15-19) DIVISIONS

1. Equipment and ammunition will be available for your use if you need to borrow
2. Shooters may provide their own shooting supplies. Loading benches and stands are available.
3. Equipment is any traditional or non-traditional NMLRA conventional muzzleloader rifle (in-lines permitted) of .54 caliber or smaller.
4. Iron or aperture sights only. No optics mounted on rifle or laser sights permitted.
5. The competition divisions are: a. Intermediate (12 -14 yrs. old), b. Senior (15 -19).
6. Equipment and ammunition will be inspected on the range before and during shooting.
7. No Coaching allowed on the shooting line during competition.
8. The Course of Fire for the Match will be Course of fire consists of 12 shots fired. Each round will consist of the following:
 - A. Three chickens at 40 yards; height of 2¼”.
 - B. Three pigs at 60 yards; height of 3”.
 - C. Three turkeys at 77 yards; height of 4½”.
 - D. Three rams at 100 yards; height of 5½”.
9. Each shooter may have one coach at the firing line who may have a scope or binoculars and advise the shooter where shots are going, keep time, or otherwise advise. The coach may not touch the shooter or any equipment after the shooter assumes a position on the firing line.
10. Match/Range Commander may provide instruction and guidance to competitors but for precaution and safety purposes only.
11. All shooting will be done from the offhand (standing) position without the aid of a sling or other artificial support. Either the military or Olympic stance is acceptable.
12. All loading will be done at the loading bench located behind the firing line. All capping, snapping of caps, flash pan charging, and firing will only take place on the firing line.
13. A maximum charge of 60 grains of black powder is allowable. Propellant must be only Black Powder, Pyrodex, or any other National Muzzleloader Rifle Association (NMLRA) approved Black Powder substitute of appropriate granulation for your rifle. A powder measure, separate from the powder container must be used when charging. No open containers of powder will be allowed on the loading benches. Load charge must be only what is considered light to moderate for your rifle.
14. Projectiles will be patched soft lead round ball only not exceeding .54 caliber (13.72mm). Plastic patching may not be used with the round ball. Any safe, non- corrosive lubrication may be used. NO sabots allowed. 20

15. Side hammer or in-line percussion cap rifles or smooth bore shoulder arms that load from the muzzle and which is not a break-open type firearm may be used. Number 209 primers are permitted. Flintlocks will be allowed.
16. Any metallic sight combination (iron sights) open and/or peep may be used. No telescopic sights. Spotting scopes are not permitted. Hand held binoculars may be in your pocket or placed on the bench as an aid in viewing targets.
17. Scoring is based on one point for each silhouette knocked down in proper sequence. Total possible points are 12!
18. Tie Breaker - Beginning at the longest targets, review combined (10 targets) scores for most hits at that distance; if still tied move to next closest target, etc. until tie is broken.
19. Participants are responsible for loss or damage of their equipment, and for property damage/harm to themselves, and as inflicted upon others.
20. The Tournament Directors or Match/Range Commander reserves the right to alter the Match as time, weather, terrain, unforeseen circumstances, or number of competitors might dictate.

3-Positon Pellet Air Rifle

1. Classes:
 - Plinker Class
 - Hunter Class
 - Sporter
 - Precision
 - See separate page for listing of rifles.
2. Each shooter will fire from 3 positions. Prone, Standing and Kneeling, in that order, at 10 meters (33 feet).
3. Hunter, Sporter & Precision Classes will shoot 10 shots at each position for a total of 30 shots. Plinker Class will shoot 5 shots at each position for a total of 15 shots.
4. Targets are the standard NRA AR-5/10 for the Hunter, Sporter classes. Plinker class will use the single bull TQ 18 Targets.
5. Firing Time is limited to 10 minutes for position (1 minute per shot).
6. Sighting is limited to 5 minutes with unlimited shots before the prone position only.
7. Shooters provide their own ammunition .177 caliber only.
8. Rifles must be loaded and fired in a single shot fashion only.
9. Slings are allowed in the prone and kneeling position only, slings are not allowed in the standing position.
10. Kneeling rolls are allowed.
11. No coaching on the line
12. Physically challenged accommodations must be requested at registration and approved by the rifle director.
13. Tiebreakers: Ties will be broken with the most number of "tens," most number of "nines," most number of "eights," etc. Second tiebreakers will be the first "ten" hit in sequence until the tie is broken.
14. The Match Director reserves the right to alter the event as weather, terrain or enrollment dictates
15. Shooting blocks/shell holders are allowed on the line.
16. Clear bore indicators (CBI's) will be furnished during inspection and are expected to be used during competition.

17. No scopes or magnified sights.

18. Iron sights will include open, peep and fiber optic sights.

Air Rifle Classifications

Plinker

A Plinker class air rifle is a .177 caliber, pump type rifle that is an entry level, inexpensive air rifle costing less than \$100, and having a muzzle velocity less than 600fps.

Hunter

A Hunter class air rifle is a .177 caliber, typically a break action (spring air) or pump rifle (occasionally a Pre-Charged Pneumatic (PCP) or C02) that is a mid-level air rifle costing more than \$100, but less than \$525, and having a muzzle velocity less than 600fps. Exception is Daisy Avanti 753, 853, 953, 887 and 888 models since their characteristics are similar to rifles in the Sporter class.

Sporter

A Sporter class air rifle is a .177 caliber rifle that is either pump, spring air, PCP or C02 powered and is a higher quality rifle. The rifle must be available to 4-H clubs for less than \$525, and have a muzzle velocity less than 600fps. The acceptable rifles and their characteristics are governed by the 2014-2016 National Standard Three-Position Air Rifle Rule Book, 10th edition. The rules can be viewed or downloaded at <http://thecmp.org/wp-content/uploads/Rules.pdf> See Rule 4.2.1)

Precision

A Precision class air rifle is a .177 caliber rifle that is either pump, spring air, PCP or C02 powered and is a very high quality rifle. There is no price limitation and must have a muzzle velocity less than 600fps. The acceptable rifles and their characteristics are governed by the 2014-2016 National Standard Three Position Air Rifle Rule Book, 10th edition. The rules can be viewed or downloaded at <http://thecmp.org/wp-content/uploads/Rules.pdf> (See Rule 4.4)

General Rules

All air rifles must not exceed 600fps velocity

All air rifles must be .177 caliber (.22 caliber rifles are not allowed)

Must be a single shot air rifle

No telescopic sights (scopes) are allowed (except for air rifle silhouettes matches)

Thumbhole or pistol grips stocks are not allowed (except rifle models listed acceptable in the National Three-Position Rules or in the Precision class)

All rifles must accept a clear barrel indicator (CBI)

AK or AR type rifles are not allowed

If the match does not follow the rules above for rifle classifications, or modifies them, the rules governing the match must be published prior to the match with the registration information.

Manufacturer's Suggested Retail Price (MSRP) applies when determining gun cost.

Rifles not on the approved list will be assigned on the day of the match by the Match Director, and based on the 2014-2016 National Standard Three-Position Air Rifle Rule Book, 10th edition and/or on the features and cost as listed on CM, Airgun Depot or Pyramid Air websites. The Match Director's decision is final.

RANGE COMMANDS

Air Rifle and Small-bore Rifle

I. Shooters to the Line (5-10 minutes)

- This is the time the shooters use to get their equipment to the shooting line.
- Firearms are uncased at the shooting line.
- Firearms are pointed down range, muzzle down range.
- Firearms are not handled.

II. Preparation Time Has Started (5-10 minutes)

- Shooters may prepare the equipment for their particular shooting position.
- May handle firearm with no ammo.
- Fingers outside of trigger guard.

III. Is The Line Ready?

- Ready on the Left - If answer is no, please give more time; if yes, continue.
- Ready on the Right - If answer is no, please give more time; if yes, continue.
- The Line is Ready

IV. Shooters Load Your Firearm

- Single load only.
- DO NOT FIRE.

V. Commence to Fire

- Fire designated rounds.
- When finished shooting, lay firearm down with action open and muzzle down range.

VI. Cease Fire

- Muzzle down range, action open and LAY FIREARMS DOWN.
- It may mean:
 1. Problem on the line.
 2. That particular discipline or round is over.
 3. A new set of targets
 4. Examine your targets down range.
 5. Range is unsafe.

VII. Is The Line Clear?

- If you hear a "no," see what the problem is.

VIII. Range is Closed

- Shooter cases the firearm, picks up his/her equipment and paraphernalia and removes it from the firing line.
- Absolutely no handling of uncased firearm.

Air Pistol

1. The air pistol competition will be held at 10 meters.
2. Shooting will be from standing position. (Jr class bench rest only)
3. Pistol may be CO₂, air, spring or pump
4. Pistols must be open sighted.
5. Caliber must be .177
6. Shooting will be done single shot.
7. Targets to be used are NRA licensed B40.
8. Shooters may confer with their coach at their own discretion, NOT the coach's.
9. Course of fire:
 - a. 5 minutes for unlimited sighters
 - b. 30 minutes to fire 20 shots on 4 bulls
 - c. 5 shots on each bull
10. NRA **International Pistol** rules govern anything not covered.
11. Tiebreakers: ties will be broken with the most number of "tens," the most number of "nines," the most number of "eights," etc. The second tiebreaker will be the first "ten" hit in sequence until the tie is broken.

Archery

- **Archery 150 Round – IS a 4-H National Invitational qualifying event**
Tiebreakers will be most number of X's, 2nd tiebreaker will be # of ends with 5 X's.
Competitors may shoot two ends of practice or 10 arrows
Junior competitors will shoot at 10 yards, 5 arrows per end, with a total of 30 arrows.
Intermediate competitors will shoot at 15 yards, 5 arrows per end, with a total of 30 arrows.
Senior competitors will shoot at 20 yards, 5 arrows per end, with a total of 30 arrows.
- **Archery 3-D – IS a 4-H National Invitational qualifying event**
Binoculars allowed. Cannot walk up to target prior to shooting. **(NO range finding devices allowed)**
Competitors will need to estimate yardage and shoot at 3-D foam animal targets.
Tiebreaker will be decided by:
1-Number of 10s
2-Number of 8s
3-Number of 5s
If a tie cannot be broken, then the first point will be dropped.
Junior competitors will shoot at 5-20 yards, 2 arrows per animal, with a total of 28 arrows.
Intermediate competitors will shoot at 5-30 yards, 2 arrows per animal, with a total of 28 arrows.
Senior competitors will shoot at 5-40 yards, 2 arrows per animal, with a total of 28 arrows.
- **Archery Outdoor FITA – IS a 4-H National Invitational qualifying event**
Competitors will be shooting at 48" Olympic FITA Archery Targets.
A total of 30 arrows will be shot for the score. Two rounds of 5 arrows will be shot at each yardage.
Junior competitors will shoot at 10, 20, and 30 yards.
Intermediates competitors will shoot at 20, 30, and 40 yards.
Senior competitors will shoot at 30, 40, and 50 yards.
NOTE: The large Olympic FITA Targets compensate for the long distance.
- **Field Archery Round (marked distances from 5 – 40 yards)**
Target: NFAA targets of sizes selected by the management and appropriate to the course.
Distance:
Cause of Fire: 14 targets with at least one fan and one walk-up target, 4 arrows per target.
Scoring: 5, 4, and 3 from the center outward. Tie breaks will be greatest # or X's, then # of 5's, # of 4's, # or 3's. Then by target by target comparison, starting with target #1 until broken.
Junior competitors will shoot at 5 – 20 yards, 4 arrows per target, with a total of 56 arrows.
Intermediate competitors will shoot at 5 – 30 yards, 4 arrows per target, with a total of 56 arrows.
Senior competitors will shoot at 5 – 40 yards, 4 arrows per target, with a total of 56 arrows.

Shawano County 4-H All-Star Summer Shootout Rules

General Archery Rules

1. For the 150 Round Archery Team Shoot, youth will shoot age-appropriate distance and adults will shoot at 20 yards.
2. Only target or field points are to be used. No hunting points.
3. All types of bows (except foot-bows and crossbows) are permitted, i.e. longbows, recurves and compounds.

RECURVE/LONGBOW BAREBOW

- No sights (no string peep sights)
- No mechanical releases
- No stabilizer
- No tape or marks on bow

RECURVE/LONGBOW OPEN

- Any accessories acceptable

COMPOUND BAREBOW

- No sights (no string peep sights)
- Finger shooters only
- No stabilizers
- No tape or marks on bow

COMPOUND LIMITED

- Fixed sights
- String peep permitted
- Finger shooter
- Stabilizer 12" or less is permitted
- No sliding sights
- No magnified sights

COMPOUND BOWHUNTER/RELEASE

- No laser sights
- String peep permitted
- Mechanical releases
- Stabilizer 12" or less permitted
- No magnified sights
- No back bars or v-bars

COMPOUND UNLIMITED

- No laser sights
- Any type of stabilizers
- Any release
- All accessories acceptable

5. All scoring will be done by the scoring judge. Any arrow or target touched before scoring will be scored as a zero. All arrows that miss the target or hit the wrong target will be scored as a zero.
6. Scoring is determined by the position of the shaft. The shaft must touch the scoring ring to score the higher value. Any questionable call will immediately be determined by range commander. The range commander's decision is final.
7. Bounce outs or pass through will be scored only if the judge can unquestionably determine the point of impact, otherwise, these will be re-shot at the end of the round.
8. Time limit is four minutes per end (5 arrows) for the 150 Round.
- 9 NAA whistle commands will be used.
10. On a 5-spot target, the shooter may shoot the spots in any order and as many arrows into any spot as the archer desires. Not to exceed 5 arrows per end.
11. NFAA single spots or 5 spot target will be used. Shooters must choose single or 5 spots at check-in time. No charges allowed thereafter.
12. Coaches will be allowed to assist in repairing equipment, (15 minutes time limit will be allowed for repairs if needed.) but are not allowed to make tuning adjustments during the competition.
13. Physically challenged accommodations must be requested at registration and approved by the Archery Commander.
14. Scorecard will be rechecked for mathematical errors and corrected.

ARCHERY WHISTLE COMMANDS

Whistle: Two Blasts

Verbal Command: "Archers to the shooting line."

Meaning: Archers pick up their bow and take their position on the shooting line. Arrows must be kept in the quiver.

Whistle: One Blast

Verbal Command: "Begin shooting!"

Meaning: Archers may now take their arrows out of their quivers and begin shooting.

Whistle: Three Blasts

Verbal Command: "Walk forward and get your arrows."

Meaning: Archers have completed shooting. All archers have set their bows down and are behind the waiting line. They may now go forward to pull their arrows.

Whistle: Four or More Blasts (a series of blasts)

Verbal Command: "STOP, STOP, STOP, STOP!" or "CEASE FIRE!"

Meaning: Archers immediately let down and put their arrows back into the quiver. There is an emergency on the range.
