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### 3:00pm Workshop Descriptions

**Workshop Title:** Julie Through the System

**Presenter(s):** Urban Underground

**Workshop Description:**

Participants walk through the process of arrest to incarceration as "Julie/Julian," a young person who is arrested after remaining at a bus stop where an altercation broke out. Participants must make decisions along the way that affect how deeply within the juvenile justice system they are processed.

**Goals & Objectives:**

- To provide participants with a greater understanding of how youth are processed through the juvenile justice system.
- To provide context to terminology specific to the juvenile justice system.

**Workshop Title:** Your Story is Your SuperPower
