Welcome! We are glad you are interested in attending the 2023 Citizenship Washington Focus (CWF) in Washington, D.C., to be held from June 24-July 1, 2023. We are passing along registration information from National 4-H Council to you. Registration is a **two-step process**, registering and completing your health form in your 4H Online and mailing completed National Code of Conduct and Media Release forms.

- Register for CWF and complete/update your Health Form in your 4-HOnline account between 4:00 p.m., Dec. 1 and midnight Dec. 31. (Registration instructions are attached.) Program week assignments will be made on a *first come, first serve basis* so register early if you have summer conflicts.
- National Code of Conduct and Media Release Forms will be mailed to you in March in your confirmation letter. Return your signed forms postmarked no later than April 1, 2023 to the State 4-H Office. Thank you ahead of time for completing and returning forms as soon as you receive them!

Cost: The cost for CWF will be *approximately* \$1,750 per person (the total will be determined as soon as transportation costs are confirmed.) Check with your county office about scholarship opportunities. It is up to you to work with your county 4-H office to determine just how much of this cost you will personally be responsible for paying. Counties will be invoiced in February with their payment due April 1.

Cancellation policy: If you decide to cancel after January 15, you will be responsible for the entire program cost for your reservation if a substitute delegate cannot be identified. Substitute must be of the same gender after certain deadlines (vary by week assigned). Cancellation must be sent **in writing (by email, fax or regular mail)** to your County 4-H Office and the State 4-H Office.

Travel: Delegates will travel by coach bus with qualified 4-H Adult Advisors to Washington, D.C. from points as convenient as we can arrange for you. Departure points are anticipated to be Eau Claire, Wausau, Madison and Milwaukee, In some cases, you may be able to carpool with other delegates to the departure/return site; otherwise you will be responsible for your own transportation to that location.

WISCONSIN 4-H YOUTH DEVELOPMENT 2023 Citizenship Washington Focus (CWF) Program

- **WHAT:** A memorable and fun-filled educational week in the nation's capital based in Washington, DC. Explore our nation's history while networking with 4-H teens from across the country and learning first-hand about civic leadership.
- WHO: Enrolled 4-H members who are in grades 10-12 may participate. Adult Advisors will be selected at a ratio of one per ten youth to accompany the groups on two different weeks in June-July. (Interested adults should apply in 4HOnline. Applications due February 15. Adult leaders must be at least 21 years of age and complete WI 4-H Youth Protection Program. Mandatory Adult Advisor training workshop will be held in May 2023.
- WHEN: Departure will be on Saturday with return to Wisconsin on Sunday of your assigned week's program, week 3, June 24-July 1, 2023. Mandatory Orientation Teleconference/Zooms will scheduled. Final details and a Participant Guide will be sent in a confirmation letter. - **WHERE:** A hotel TBD in Washington, DC. A motor coach will make pickups at Eau Claire, Wausau, Madison and Milwaukee before traveling overnight to Washington, D.C. area. Return sites are the same.
- **COST:** Tentative registration fees including coach travel are approximately \$1,750 depending on transportation costs. Final fees will be confirmed and announced in late February. No cancellations can be accepted and no refunds will be issued after January 15, 2023. Medical emergencies will be considered for partial refund on a case by case basis. Same-gender substitutions may be made until March 1. Payment is due to your county 4-H office by March 15 written payable to UW-Madison Extension.
- HOW: All youth grades 10-12 may register for CWF. Please contact your 4-H Staff Member regarding possible financial assistance/scholarship procedures and deadlines. If you do not receive county funding, you will be responsible for the entire registration cost. Youth can register for 2023 CWF through 4H Online between 4:00 p.m. December 1 to midnight December 31. Online registration procedures are included on the reverse side of this information sheet. Youth will be assigned to the different weeks' programs on a first-come, first-serve basis. All registered youth will be notified whether they are confirmed or on a waiting list in early March. Be sure to complete your 4HOnline health form when you register.

Program Description: The purpose of the Citizenship Washington Focus (CWF) program is for 10th-12th grade youth to gain leadership skills and learn about government processes through hands-on activities, workshops, large group discussions, committee work, role play, and youth networking time. The event is held in Washington, DC. Participants depart home on a Saturday, are away for seven days, returning the following Satirday. (See maps in the delegation handbook for specific departure/return times http://fvi.uwex.edu/wi4hedopp/citizenship-washington-focus/) Chaperones are active 4-H volunteers that have completed the youth protection process. The ratio of youth participants to adults is 10:1. Participants will spend the most time under the direct supervision of college age trained Program Assistants and adult leaders. Health staff consists of volunteers who have first aid and/or nursing training. Participants will sleep on board motor coaches enroute between Wisconsin and Washington D.C. Lodging will be provided with multiple youth of same gender in rooms with bunk beds and use a dorm restroom with private showers; males and female participants are housed in separate rooms on the same floor of the dorm. To the best of our ability, Adult Advisors are assigned to rooms on the same floors as their assigned delegates. Participants will eat in public cafeterias, fast food or other restaurants. Meals are prepared in large industrial or restaurant kitchens so individual meal accommodations may not be possible. During the conference, adults and youth will participate in large group activities which may involve any of the following: discussion, writing, reading aloud; role plays or skits, running, dancing, climbing stairs, standing or sitting for long periods, or having personal contact with other participants; they will walk distances of several miles on sidewalks during off site excursions; they will ride motor coaches round trip from Wisc

FIND THE EVENT

- Log into your family account at https://v2.4honline.com/#/user/sign-in and look at your member list.
- Click on the events tab on the left hand side.
- Select the name of the member you want to register.
- Select the event.
- Click on the "Register" button.

REGISTER FOR THE EVENT

- Read and/or complete any required certification or forms requested.
- Enter specific information related to the event. This may include program week preference, t-shirt size, bus boarding choices, etc. Any required fields are in bold.
