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ANIMAL SCIENCE JUDGING

STATE DAIRY JUDGING

County 4-H teams compete at district dairy judging contests during regional Area Animal Science Days for the chance to attend the State 4-H Dairy Judging Contest. State winners in the senior division go on to represent Wisconsin at the All-American Dairy Show in Harrisburg, PA, World Dairy Expo in Madison, WI, and the North American International Livestock Exposition in Louisville, KY.

STATE LIVESTOCK JUDGING

The State Livestock Judging Contest selects our state winners for National Competition. The top senior team travels to Louisville, KY. The second-place senior team travels to Denver, CO. MEATS JUDGING

This contest tests the knowledge of youth in the placement of carcass and retail cut classes, carcass grading, retail cut identification, and a quiz. This contest occurs annually with the top teams traveling to Kansas City, MO and Denver, CO for national competition.

4-H LIVESTOCK QUIZ BOWL & SKILLATHON

Livestock Quiz Bowl is a quiz competition with questions about beef, sheep, swine, and meat goat topics. Teams of students buzz in to orally answer questions given by a moderator.

The Skillathon contest includes a written quiz and learning, stations such as breed identification, feed identification, equipment identification, and team activities such as demonstrating evaluation skills. IGNITE BY 4-H

Ignite by 4-H brings together teen agriculture and science leaders from across the country to focus on learning about and solving current agri-science issues. Students work with each other and experts in the agricultural community to develop a community change project to initiate in their state. Members are nominated for this experience locally by staff and then selected to attend through a state level process.

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4-H DAIRY QUIZBOWL

This contest provides an educational dairy program for all dairy project members, including those who may not own a dairy project animal, and provides a way to develop alertness, self-confidence, teamwork skills, and mastery in the area of dairy science.

Teams of four members compete with each other in giving oral answers to questions posed by a moderator.

AREA ANIMAL SCIENCE DAYS

Area Animal Science Days is a series of day-long events held around the state in June where youth in the beef, dairy, horse, sheep, and swine projects increase their decision-making skills and knowledge of animals through judging and grading experiences.

- Increases the knowledge of animals through breeding and market evaluation and management information
- Open to 4-H youth in grades 3-12
- Increases decision-making skills through judging and grading experiences

STATE 4-H DOG AGILITY SHOW

This show includes competitions in agility for dogs and their people. This event is open to youth enrolled in the 4-H Dog Project. Dogs of different levels of abilities and training are welcome.

STATE 4-H HORSE EDUCATION DAYS, HORSE BOWL, & HIPPOLOGY CONTEST

State Horse Education Days occurs annually in June and provides an opportunity for youth in grades 3-13 enrolled in the 4-H Horse Project to demonstrate their knowledge of equine-related subject matter in a competitive setting. Youth answer questions in teams of 3-4 members and compete against other teams in the same class. These events consist of quiz-style questions about the following topics: Nutrition and Feed, Health and Diseases, History, Evolution and Breeds, Reproduction and Genetics.

4-H DRAMA COMPANY

This group creates an original show incorporating acting, music, and dance. Show content is developed collaboratively between company members and the director. Each Drama Company member contributes ideas for the show, then refines and develops those ideas with the support of the rest of the company, culminating in a final performance during Summer Academy. Connecting with other members from around the state is another important aspect of being a part of Drama Company.

4-H ARTS TEAM

Youth create a collaborative piece of artwork and works to artistically support statewide programming opportunities. Team members teach seminars, train to be peer leaders for county and regional events, and curate an art show for Summer Academy. The 4-H Arts Team is led by a professional artist who teaches team members artistic techniques using a variety of mediums.

COMMUNICATION & MEDIA TEAM

Youth will work with education, Media/News and Marketing professionals to promote Wisconsin 4-H. The Team will be together during a spring planning weekend and Summer Academy where they will build their understanding of graphic design, photography, social media, and journalism while promoting Wisconsin 4-H.

AWARDS & Scholarships



KEY AWARDS

The Wisconsin 4-H Key Award Program is one of the highest recognitions a 4-H member can receive. This award recognizes a select group of 4-H participants who have demonstrated consistent growth in their 4-H involvement, developed and applied their leadership skills, and actively participated in the functions of their 4-H club and community. To be eligible, candidates for this award must be in grade 9 or older, and must have completed at least three years of 4-H and one year of youth leadership.

CROWLEY DAIRY LEADERSHIP AWARD

The 4-H Dairy Leadership Award provides recognition to youth who have excelled in their Dairy Project. Eligibility for this award includes: current enrollment in the 4-H Dairy Project and have at least two previous years of membership, must be in grades 10-13 as of January 1, and should have an outstanding record of involvement and accomplishments in the 4-H Dairy Project.

Fifteen (15) state-level awards are to be presented annually to outstanding 4-H Dairy Project members. Award plaques will be given to the top fifteen and the top three youth will each receive \$1,000 cash awards. Youth that have received a plaque only are encouraged to apply again.

Additionally, the top 4-H member that is a Junior in high school as of January 1, 2025 will be offered a \$5,000 scholarship to attend the University of Wisconsin-Madison and enroll in the Department of Dairy and Animal Sciences.

WISCONSIN 4-H FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP

The Wisconsin 4-H Foundation awards scholarships to outstanding Wisconsin 4-H members and alumni pursuing higher education in 2025. Wisconsin 4-H Foundation scholarships are awarded to students based on demonstrated personal growth through 4-H, development and leadership in 4-H, academic performance, and future educational goals. Applicants who are awarded scholarships will be notified by postal letter and email in May.
