







Together, we explore the natural world with a special focus on wildlife, wildlife habitats, and trees. WISCONSIN SHOOTING SPORTS

The Wisconsin 4-H program uses the National 4-H Shooting Sports curriculum to teach shooting sports safety to more than 5,000 youth. Shooting Sports in 4-H offers year-round training and fun competitive events for youth members in grades 3-13. Training programs in air pistol, air rifle, archery, muzzleloading, pistol, rifle, shotgun, and gun safety are available.

Youth in training are eligible to participate in the fifteen state competitive events throughout the year and for those interested their qualifying scores will determine who represents Wisconsin on the state's National Championship Team.

State winners in the senior division go on to represent Wisconsin at the All-American Dairy Show in Harrisburg, PA, World Dairy Expo in Madison, WI, and the North American International Livestock Exposition in Louisville, KY.

STATE LIVESTOCK JUDGING

4-H LIVESTOCK QUIZ BOWL & SKILLATHON

Livestock Quiz Bowl is a quiz competition with questions about beef, sheep, swine, and meat goat topics. Teams of students buzz in to orally answer questions given by a moderator.

The Skillathon contest includes a written quiz and learning, stations such as breed identification, feed identification, equipment identification, and team activities such as demonstrating evaluation skills. The top senior level 4-H team will represent Wisconsin at the National 4-H Skillathon Contest, held each fall in Louisville, KY.

4-H DAIRY QUIZ BOWL

This contest provides an educational dairy program for all dairy project members, including those who may not own a dairy project animal, and provides a way to develop alertness, self-confidence, teamwork skills, and mastery in the area of dairy science.

Teams of four members compete with each other in giving oral answers to questions posed by a moderator.




STATE 4-H DOG OBEDIENCE & SHOWMANSHIP SHOW

STATE 4-H HORSE EDUCATION DAYS, HORSE BOWL, & HIPPOLOGY CONTEST

State Horse Education Days occurs annually in May and provides an opportunity for youth in grades 3-13 enrolled in the 4-H Horse Project to demonstrate their knowledge of equine-related subject matter in a competitive setting. Youth answer questions in teams of 3-4 members and compete against other teams in the same class. These events consist of quiz-style questions about the following topics: Nutrition and Feed, Health and Diseases, History, Evolution and Breeds, Reproduction and Genetics.

STATE ARTS TEAMS

4-H ARTS TEAM

Youth create collaborative artwork and work to support statewide programming opportunities artistically. Team members teach seminars, train to be peer leaders for county and regional events, and curate an art exhibition for Summer Academy. The 4-H Arts Team is led by a professional artist who teaches team members artistic techniques using a variety of mediums.

COMMUNICATION & MEDIA TEAM

You will create original content, (Video, social media, digital promotional materials) to promote the 4-H story in Wisconsin. Working with an advisor, you build a community of digital storytellers through skill development and handson practice while working with media and marketing professionals. Using youth voices, you create a vision for telling the story of Wisconsin 4-H.

4-H DRAMA COMPANY

This group of youth from around the state to create an original stage performance incorporating acting, song, music, and dance in the five days leading up to the Summer Academy. Show content is a collaborative effort between their company members and their directors. Each Drama Company member contributes ideas for the show and works with the group to problem-solve issues on the set and in the script culminating in a final performance.

Delve into how your sparks can lead to lifelong learning and successful career pathways in this 100% virtual program. Youth will gain experience with creative problem solving strategies and work with peers and adults to become ready for work and ready for life. Winter Academy is designed for youth in their first years of high school. 


Ignite by 4-H brings together teen agriculture and science leaders from across the country for four days to collaborate, connect, and cultivate passion with hands-on

JAMES W. CROWLEY DAIRY LEADERSHIP AWARD

Named in honor and memory of James W. Crowley, a longtime Extension Dairy Specialist and strong supporter of the dairy youth project, this award provides recognition to youth who have excelled in their Dairy Project. Eligibility for this award includes: current enrollment in the 4-H Dairy Project and have at least two previous years of membership, must be in grades 10-13 as of January 1, and should have an outstanding record of involvement and accomplishments in the 4-H Dairy Project. Fifteen state awards are to be presented and recognized with a plaque annually to outstanding 4-H Dairy Project members. The top three youth will each receive \$1,000 cash awards. Youth that have received a plaque only are encouraged to apply again. Additionally, the top awardee that is a Junior in high school as of January 1, 2025 is offered a \$5,000 scholarship to attend the University of Wisconsin-Madison and enroll in the Department of Dairy and Animal Sciences.

Applications open May 1 and are due July 1. Award notifications announced early August.
